ABOUT THE POSITION:

This position functions as the Fire Crew Supervisor of the McKenzie River Crew. This position will supervise/lead 20 firefighters. This position requires that you have a background in pre-suppression, suppression and fuels management. Serves as a first line supervisor of a fire crew with a full range of supervisory duties. Responsibilities include; providing leadership in accomplishing fire management objectives, the day-to-day operation of the fire crew, prepares schedules and work plans, sets work priorities, and supervises operations of the fire crew in responding to wild land fires. Provides for crew safety and welfare and implements a training program in compliance with applicable requirements. Other duties include fuels and prescribed burning work as well as other resource management activities. Applicants should be highly motivated self-starters with a strong interest in developing knowledge and skills as part of a complex and dynamic fire and fuels program. Minimum red card qualifications are ICT4T and CRWB. The position also requires the incumbent to have a valid State Drivers License.

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THE DUTY STATION

The position will be stationed in McKenzie Bridge, Oregon. Applicants must apply to this location if they wish to be considered.

ABOUT MCKENZIE RIVER RANGER DISTRICT

McKenzie River Ranger District, 57600 McKenzie Hwy, McKenzie Bridge, OR 97413, 541-822-3381. The beautiful McKenzie River Hwy is a 100 mile long corridor stretching between Sisters to the east and Springfield to the west. Renowned for fishing, the McKenzie River supports spring Chinook salmon, winter steelhead and summer steelhead as well as native rainbow, cutthroat and bull trout. The high lakes have been planted with brown and brook trout, making the McKenzie River Corridor an outdoor sports paradise. The West Cascades National Scenic Byway has some of the most spectacular scenery in Oregon. The area includes the popular Terwilliger Hot Springs, Sahalie Falls, Clear Lake, and Hoodoo Ski Area. ABOUT THE COMMUNITY OF MCKENZIE BRIDGE

McKenzie Bridge is one of nine small communities located in the McKenzie river valley between the cities of Eugene and Bend. The community of Blue River is located about 13 miles from the Ranger Station. Services found in these two communities include restaurants, lodging, groceries, gas, churches and a medical clinic. Daily bus service from the Eugene area to the Ranger Station is available for more complete shopping or entertainment needs.

Grades K through 12 are taught at the McKenzie School District in Blue River.

The climate in the area is typical for the west side of the Oregon Cascade Mountain Range. The average rainfall is 65 inches annually, occurring mostly from October to April. The Ranger Station is located at 1600 feet elevation and sees snow on occasion during the winter months. At higher elevations, winter snows accumulate and persist until mid-summer. Summertime temperatures range from the high 80's to the mid 50's, with lows in the 30's in the higher elevation.

Housing opportunities are available in the McKenzie Valley within easy commuting distance. Prices vary in each area; but folks can expect to pay from \$500-1000 per month for rentals depending on needs. Home prices are moderate and there are some options for home purchases ranging in price from \$160,000 to \$450,000+.

The District may have government housing available near the ranger station compound in McKenzie Bridge; rates range from \$560-\$735 per month.

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ABOUT THE EUGENE/SPRINGFIELD COMMUNITY...

Eugene/Springfield is located in the Willamette Valley, with the Cascade Mountain Range to the east and the Coast Range to the west. It is about 110 miles south of Portland, Oregon. The elevation is 426 feet. The population is 154,620 within the City of Eugene, and 50,150 in adjacent Springfield.

The average temperatures range from 36.9 F to 48.6 F in December and 51.2 F to 82.2 F in August. Average yearly rainfall is 46.6 inches, which occurs primarily from October to April. Significant snowfall is rare.

There is a wide variety of recreational opportunities available in the area including: backpacking, fishing, hunting, cross-country skiing, downhill skiing, rafting and canoeing, sailing, cycling, mountain biking, and horseback riding. There are eleven golf courses in the area. Some of the local events include: Eugene Celebration, Bach Festival, and Springfield Filbert Festival. The City is home to symphony, opera, ballet, modern dance organizations and several theater groups. Eugene is known as the "Track and Field Capital of the United States."

Medical Services are provided by Sacred Heart and McKenzie-Willamette Hospitals, which provide a wide range of medical services. There are numerous physicians of all specialties in the area.

The area includes three public school districts and numerous private schools. Public institutions offering higher education are the University of Oregon and Lane Community College.

Eugene and Springfield's housing is plentiful. A three-bedroom, two-bath, 1600 square-foot home will range from \$160,000 to \$220,000. The average rental price for a 3-bedroom home is \$700-900 per month and the average apartment/duplex rents for \$500-700 per month.

Eugene and Springfield are full service community with numerous retailers.
